## Application for Approval of Details reserved by Condition 3 pursuant to planning permission 21/o3195/F at Begbroke Science Park

On behalf of our client, Oxford University Development Ltd (OUD), Lichfields has today submitted via the Planning Portal (Ref PP-11237635) information for the approval of details reserved by Condition 3 attached to Planning Permission 21/03195/F (dated 4 February 2022) in relation to Begbroke Science Park.

## Condition 3

Condition 3 attached to 21/03195/F states:
"No development shall commence until the development site has been checked by a suitably qualified ecologist to ensure that there is no presence of protected species that have moved on to the site since previous surveys have taken place and which could be harmed by the development. Should protected species be found details of mitigation measures to prevent their harm shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be implemented in accordance with the agreed scheme.

Reason: To ensure the protection of protected species in accordance with Policies ESD10 and Bicester 1 of the Cherwell Local Plan Part 1 2011-2031 and Government guidance contained within the National Planning Policy Framework".

## LICHFIELDS

In response to this condition, BSG Ecology conducted a protected species walkover survey on 20 April 2022 at the site and adjacent areas of vegetation out to 30 metres. A letter setting out the methodology used and the results of the survey accompany this submission. In summary, no new ecology issues were noted, and the project ecologist is confident that the measures already in place or scheduled are sufficient to manage ecological issues at the site.
