Hello Lewis

Native species are used and I wondered if this was a requirement for a good BREEAM score?

Would prefer they replace Crataegus, the native hawthorn with Silver Birch, which although native is very ornamental with its white bark. This tree produces dappled shade and will complement the Sorbus arias quite well.

The native species beneath the trees are quite uninspiring.....usually used in natural landscape structure planting. I suggest a groundcover of native honeysuckle, Lonicera periclymenum, planted 3/m2, supplied in 2 L containers.

All plant sizes are acceptable.

A commitment for maintenance is necessary. Plant supply, planting operations and aftercare are all to be in accordance with the Horticultural Trade Association's National plant Specification
