Comments	<p>I am writing to object to the Manor Oak Homes Planning Application on the grounds of the Deer Act 1991. This is a legal indication that aims to protect wild deer in England and Wales.</p> <p>This act states that the intentional cruelty towards wild deer is against the law. Members of the wider community have often seen wild deer lying in and running through the fields that this development is planned on. We are concerned that this development will intentionally destroy the quality of life of wild deer which will go against the Deer Act 1991.</p> <p>I would also like to draw your attention to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. This is a legal indication that aims to protect flora, fauna and the countryside of Great Britain. https://www.legislation.gov.uk/ukpga/1981/69</p> <p>Many of us in the community are interested in bird watching. We take great pleasure in watching wild birds fly around our area. 1 a and 1 aa of this law both aim to protect birds who are nesting or are seeking to nest in areas of the countryside. I know there are birds who are living in the planned area or would look to settle amongst its surrounding trees and am worried about the loss of habitat for these animals.</p> <p>There are plenty of other wildlife and plants that this law covers that will be damaged by this project.</p> <p>I would also like to draw your attention to Wild Mammals Protection Act 1995. This is a legal indication that aims to protect wild mammals from deliberate cruelty. https://www.legislation.gov.uk/ukpga/1996/3/contents</p> <p>Many of us in the local community can recount seeing wild mammals in this area on multiple occasions if not as a daily occurrence. It is certain that their natural habitat would be partially if not totally destroyed by this development and thus would break this law. Thus, we would also like to object.</p> <p>To conclude, we are very concerned as members of the local community whose opinions are shared by much of our neighbours.</p> <p>As well as the impact on the wildlife. I am extremely concerned about the extra traffic on the Warwick road and surrounding areas particularly during school times.</p> <p>On the note of school times. I am concerned about the need for more school places, both primary and secondary schools.</p> <p>GP surgeries and the local hospital are already at bursting point. Another 170 homes with no additional services is ill thought out and frankly irresponsible.</p>
