Poplar (G1) - fell, Group of poplar all suffering severe heart wood decay to the extent that they have become dangerous Yew (T4) - fell, tree is causing damage to tennis court and very close to mature pine

Thuja (T5) - Fell, tree is overhanging tennis court and pathway
