RESPONSE TO CONSULTATION

- 5.1. <u>CDC Ecology</u> The updated LEMP addresses my previous comments in point 7.4. The LEMP condition can be discharged.
- 5.2. <u>CDC Landscape -</u> Relevant Standards and Legislation I would also include the most current recommendations for trees BS 8545: 2014 Trees: from nursery to independence in the landscape Recommendations. Shrubs Species and cultivars are to be pruned particularly to maximise flowering and berrying for amenity and wildlife.

APPRAISAL

6.1. Condition 28 states the following:

Prior to the first occupation of the development hereby approved, a Landscape and Ecology Management Plan (LEMP) shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Thereafter, the LEMP shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.

Reason: To protect habitats of importance to biodiversity conservation from any loss or damage in accordance with Policy ESD10 of the Cherwell Local Plan 2011 – 2031 Part 1 and Government guidance contained within Section 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

6.2. The applicants have agreed to the additional minor requirements set out by the Landscape and Ecology Officers and amended the LEMP to include it and as such, the requirements of the condition are considered to be met.

- 6.3. It is noted that there are several other LEMP's that have been discharged under condition 28 as part of earlier phases.
- 6.4. The original application was EIA development. This application is not a 'subsequent application' as it is not a pre-commencement requirement. The ES accompanying the original application is still considered adequate to consider the content of this submission. The species surveys accompanying the ES confirmed that the site has limited value to protected species (except for bats) and the creation of wetland habitat remains an important enhancement for ecology and biodiversity. The LEMP sets out, inter alia, how the wetland areas will be appropriately managed and maintained, along with measures to increase structural diversity and species composition across the site, which is compatible with the conclusions of the ES. Therefore, the EIA is considered sufficient for the purpose of considering the information provided for this condition and it has been taken into account in considering this subsequent application.

1. **RECOMMENDATION**

That Planning Condition 28 of 19/01746/OUT be discharged based upon the following:
