Comments	I wish to raise my objections to yet another possible carbuncle with all the aesthetics of an abscess on a pussy boil.
	For a start this inevitably ugly monstrocity would be on prime Grade 2 and Grade 3a farmland and this proposed development will inevitably displace vital wildlife and utterly spoil the beautiful countryside which we all enjoy. With the war in Ukraine badly affecting wheat and other crop imports, this country more than ever needs its farmland to help sustain its citizens. According to Oxford.gov, 'The best and most versatile agricultural land (Grades 1, 2, and 3a) is considered to be a national resource and should not be lost'.
	I am also concerned that, if this misguided proposal is given the go-ahead, the houses will be built to the bare minimum standard (Grade E) for energy efficiency and insulation. This is a given. The properties themselves will all look the same and dressed in the same utterly incongruous red brick like all the other poorly designed homes in this area.
	I live in the village of Hanwell and when I stand and look at the views from south of the village down towards the valley below where this site is, I already see a huge Amazon warehouse and, worse, the current development at the corner of Southam Road and Duke's Meadown Drive. This proposal will simply add more concrete and general ugliness to the otherwise excellent view of a rolling valley.
