My original objection was posted on 17 May 2023. Regarding review of these two further documents I now need to consider, i.e.

- Design response; Surgery Design Study posted 14 November 2023
- Draft Heads of Terms for S106 posted 20 November 2023

These two additional documents do not alter the fact in any way that this proposed 60 home development is not required in the small village of Cropredy for reasons already stated in my original objection.

It would seem that the proposed building of 60 new homes is being overshadowed by the prospect of a new surgery. I would like to know why they think a larger surgery would better serve the vIllage. Why has the surgery allowed their patient list to grow to the point they can no longer cope in the current premises? Perhaps a study of working practices may identify a more practical/effective way forward.

This development is detrimental to the village of Cropredy. The proposed design of this new surgery would be a carbunkle on the landscape in an area of beautiful countryside and is totally unsuitable.
