We have assessed the received documents and have the following comments.

Condition 12 of 06/00967/OUT

We are unable to recommend the discharge of condition 12.

The surface water drainage scheme for the spine road and perimeter road is not in accordance with Condition 12 for the following reasons:

- The range of surface water drainage techniques proposed for the spine road is not in accordance with the Design Code dated April 2008.
- There are no calculations to demonstrate that the surface water drainage system along the roads is in accordance with the approved surface water

As outlined in our objections to the Reserved Matters applications (09/01528/REM and 09/01532/REM) for this site, the surface water drainage techniques proposed for the spine road are not in accordance with the Design Code dated April 2008. The Design Code states that 'Primary Streets' such as the spine road will feature swales or localised infiltration areas with French Drains below discharging to highway drains. The surface water drainage proposed for the spine road shown in drawings 1903/D/102 Rev K (top section of spine road), 1903/D/107 Rev K (middle section of spine road), 1903/D/108 Rev K (eastern wing of spine road), 1903/D/111 Rev G (bottom section of spine road) and 1903/D/112 Rev E (bottom section of spine road) indicate a reliance on piped drainage.

For us to find the surface water drainage system for the spine road acceptable, the design should be revised to include a range of sustainable drainage techniques in accordance with the approved Design Code. We are particularly concerned that the submitted drawing 1903/D/102 Rev K does not show the filter drains which we have previously approved for this section.

As suggested in our response to the Reserved Matters Planning Application (09/01528/REM), we suggest that surface water generated on the sections of the spine road which run through parkland should be allowed to simply run off over filter strips and onto adjacent land. This approach would be in accordance with the SUDS Management Train which advocates treating and infiltrating surface water as near to its source as possible.

The sections of the surface water drainage for the boundary road shown in drawings 1903/D/106 Rev D and 1903/D/112 Rev E includes the used of swales or ditches in accordance with the Design Code and the principle of the design is therefore acceptable to us.

The highway drainage will convey flows from large areas of the development site, not just surface water generated on the road surfaces. It is important at this detailed design stage that drainage network calculations are submitted. These calculations should demonstrate that the proposed system will be of suitable capacity to convey the flows allocated in the approved surface water drainage scheme.
