Further to my previous OBJECTIONS (made on your CDC portal and an e-mail), I wish to add the following photos taken near Kidlington Football Club on a matchday (Sat 20 April) to show the kind of poor parking we can expect on OUFC match-days/events days which will be much much worse because of the even greater numbers.

Traffic Congestion and Poor Parking Location:

I have attached 3 photos showing cars blocking the entrance to Morton Avenue at the head of the road where it meets Yarnton Road, thus causing grave danger to cars trying to exit Morton Avenue onto Yarnton Road or cars turning (blind) into Morton Avenue and meeting oncoming traffic because the parked cars have turned a two-lane road into one-lane. In summary:

Photo 1 Cars blocking exit/entrance to Morton Avenue where it meets Yarnton Road causing danger to drivers on Yarnton Rd & Morton Ave

Photo 2 Cars blocking exit/entrance to Morton Avenue where it meets Yarnton Road causing danger to drivers on Yarnton Rd & Morton Ave with driver having to drive past without knowing whether cars may be turning in (blind) to Morton Avenue from Yarnton Rd

- (a) OUFC fans with cars will make such problems far worse because of the much greater numbers. Fans do not care where they park as long as they can get a "free" space.
- (b) OUFC fans and opposition fans will mainly travel by car (whatever OUFC, OCC or anyone else says) because public transport (train, bus) is inadequate and very expensive (train).

Please note these very serious objections to traffic congestion, poor parking, road blocking and nuisance-value to local residents in Kidlington
