> The proposed building of a football stadium on the site at Kidlington roundabout will result in traffic gridlock for the residents of Kidlington and surrounding villages. The arrival of eight thousand fans, most of whom will arrive by car will result in pavements and cycle paths being used as off road parking much as they do at the moment.

> The dream of fans travelling by bicycle and train is unrealistic, speak to any fan travelling from Witney or Abingdon and they will tell you they 'will find somewhere to park'. Fans have the freedom to travel as they wish and OUFC have no way of imposing such restrictions on them.

> The current Park and Ride is used by residents of the area for travel by bus and rail and without an increase of available parking spaces would become chaotic and impossible to use on match days.

> All the normal activities of local families at weekends, shopping in Sainsburys, travelling to Oxford and beyond will be adversely affected with no benefits at all to the local population.

> Once again public land will be used for private profit.
