Comments	I live on the Garden City Estate less than a mile away from the proposed stadium site. The Triangle and Stratfield Brake are designated Green Belt which was introduced to prevent Oxford and Kidlington being swallowed up in one mass. It requires "very special circumstances" to be allowed to build on Green Belt. OUFC already use a stadium which the owners are prepared to negotiate for them to use, there are no "very special circumstances" involved. OUFC claim that the new stadium will be bio-diverse but it beggars belief that anyone could believe that a lump of concrete is better for the environment than the trees, willow, wild flowers and wildlife that is already there. OUFC claim that a large majority of fans will use public transport but I think everyone is aware that this is nonsense, if the stadium is built most fans will travel by car swamping the area with people trying to park. The park & ride will quickly fill up leaving train users and shoppers unable to park. All the roads around Garden City will be overwhelmed. The idea of closing Oxford Road and Frieze Way at the start and end of a match is not acceptable, I understand Oxford Council have already rejected this and they must stick to their guns.
