The Triangle is a designated green belt area acting as a brake between Oxford and Kidlington. It protects nature and offers breathing space betrween the two communities. The suggestion of a 16,000 person capacity stadium and hotel is motivated entirely by OCC greed. The consequences for residents of Oxford and Kidlington will be dire. There is no parking capacity worth mentioning nearby. The idea that fewer people will arrive by car than currently drive to Kassam is pure fairy tale stuff - expect 8,000 vehicles descending on Kidlington on match days, making the Parkway station unusable for residents and causing traffic jams over an extended area, effectively preventing residents of Oxford from accessing Kidlington.
