1. Spatial layout.

In the absence of any plans I can only summarise as follows:

The Kidlington triangle measures roughy 75m wide at the base and 90m S-N The kssam stadium (as a guide) is about 25m wide by 40m so would fit comfortable in the base of the triangle in a N-S orientation with surrounding space for access.

The north end however would only leave about 35 m base and 30m (about 500 sq m) to the apex of the triangle for the hotel.

2 Traffic

In the absence of a traffic analysis I can only summarise my opinion on the effect on

If half the attendees travel by car at 3 persons per car that would generate 2500 cars attending the event.

In my opinion this would saturate the Peartree, Kidlington and Cutteslowe roundabouts and invade local parking places as well a crowding the already busy A34 as well as the A4166 and A4260.

About parking - the Parkway station carpark would probably have about the asme capacity as the Kassam stadium but is charged.

I expect that there would only be parking for VIPs and those directly concerned with the production of the match itself.

Possibly underground parking is envisaged for both the stadium and the hotel.

3 Public transort

My guess is trains can deliver abut 500 people each so train from and to Oxford stationed could deliver about 2000 people an hour to Parkway station all of whom will need to cross the A4165.

4. amenities

Summertown is about 2 miles away with only one pub - the Dew Drop -so that should do good business, plus many restaurants.

5 Wildlife.

While I consider it admirable to consider wildlife in the small inaccessible wood between the triangle and the A34 I cannot see how wildlife trails West to East can be maintained across the railway line, the A34 and the A4166 to the east and the Pear tree roundabout complex to

Any trails running south to north would be obliterated.

6. Conclusion.

I feel the whole process is ill conceived and would offer a profoundly disappointing experience for Oxford United addendees.
