Four years ago, in its review of the Local Plan to 2040, CDC stressed the importance of protecting 'valued landscapes' and 'areas of tranquillity' and gave as an example the Ironstone Downs in which the village of Hornton is situated. CDC also suggested it should 'protect those areas which are relatively undisturbed by noise'.

In recent years Hornton has been subjected to a series of applications which have threatened both to damage its landscape and to destroy its tranquillity. We are grateful that CDC's planning committee rejected an application to turn Hornton's disused quarry into a fuel dump and recently prohibited racing events on the illegally expanded Wroxton Motocross track (which is in fact next to Hornton). Now comes yet another threat to landscape and tranquillity in the shape of fishing lakes and holiday buildings on land belonging to the owner of the Motocross track, who is clearly bent on transforming her farm into a series of non-agricultural businesses.

Other objectors have rightly highlighted the deleterious effects the development would have on wildlife, noise, light pollution and increased traffic on a dangerous road, and they have also pointed out the complete absence of sustainability criteria. I would like to make two further points.

The area belongs to a beautiful landscape next to an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. As such it should be preserved as countryside in perpetuity.

In the many years I have lived in this area I have not heard a single person say, 'I wish there were more opportunities for fishing around here'. There is plainly no local need for these lakes.

In short this is an unnecessary and unwanted project which should be rejected.
