Comments	<input type="text" value="I strongly object to this proposal. It is laughable that, next to the same landowner's awful motocross scar on the countryside and community, there is talk of 'tranquility' by the applicant!
It is totally unsustainable use of land, as with the motocross not serving a local need, disregarding impact on wildlife and the environment. Access too is a major issue off a road that already has serious issues in terms of risk.
The joining up with the same landowners' motocross site would create a huge swathe of development across an area that should be protected and is completely unsuitable to this sort of activity and alien to the character of the countryside. Access would be entirely by car, there is no alternative, and one wonders what pollution the actual development will produce. CDC should stop this application at the earliest opportunity, sending out a message that, at last, they are serious about protecting our countryside, environment and listening to local, emphasising local, voices.
