YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

Hi, I only came across this issue last week over the local community Facebook page, unfortunately for the last few days I've unsuccessfully been able to upload my supporting documents of why I am strongly in favour of keeping the fencing. Primarily a safety feature for my (and our neighbours) young children from running straight from the front garden down to the dipped area out the front. This is designed to collect water hence the reason the barrier is appropriate. Our front grassed lawn is directly attached to the fence and I feel that without this people will walk directly across our lawn, it happens now but would be much worse without the fencing. It is simply directing people onto the dedicated Path and not on private drives and lawns. Also parking bays and turning points are all along the fenced area which is critical for avoiding an accident waiting to happen from parking and manovering cars etc.. Particularly as the pathways lead to schools and the park. The fencing is directly outside our house and unfortunately I don't feel we have been considered in this issue so I am hoping that, although my comments are late, and far from the detail I have put together, they will now be considered.
