Bloxham has undergone a transformation from being a village with good services and adequate provision of schooling, doctors, dentist and traffic volume to a village that is now overpopulated, dentist and doctors are not able to cope and a primary school that is now virtually at full capacity due to the amount of housing that we have had to endure. This new project of a further 95 dwellings, takes the village further out of our existing limit. The access road onto what is already a very busy road is far from ideal. The medical practise has changed in the years I have lived here which is over 29 years. You no longer can get an appointment when you need one and sometimes have to wait over a week for an appointment. The primary school is virtually at capacity, I know this as I work there, the school hall and other facilities in the school are too small already for the current amount of children. Yes this new area is within view of my home, but that is not the only reason I am against this. It will also put pressure on the local nature reserve, The Slade, which the warden has worked hard to keep as a lovely wild area. I know you say there will be public open space, but it will only result in more dog walkers and more vandalism to this area. I really feel that we have had enough building - there is never enough affordable housing within these developments. Please see some sense and reject this proposal. Before you know if we will be joining up with Milcombe. It makes me sad that we are considering leaving this area because of the way the village has changed. Enough is enough.
