I have looked over the above planning application and have the following comments to make.

Location: 19 Ash Lane, Ambrosden, OX25 2RY

Description: Change of use of land to provide parking spaces associated with

residential dwelling

Recommendation:

Oxfordshire County Council, as the Local Highways Authority, hereby notify the District Planning Authority that they **do not object** to the granting of planning permission, subject to conditions.

Conditions:

Plan of Car Parking Provision (unspecified number of spaces)

Prior to the commencement of the development hereby approved, a plan showing car parking provision for vehicles to be accommodated within the site, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Thereafter, and prior to the first occupation of the development, the parking spaces shall be laid out, surfaced, drained and completed in accordance with the approved details and shall be retained for the parking of vehicles at all times thereafter.

Reason - In the interests of highway safety, to ensure the provision of off-street car parking and to comply with Government guidance contained within the National Planning Policy Framework.

Informative: Should the applicant wish to extend the dropped kerb a Section 184 agreement will be required. Further details can be found on the Councils website via - https://www2.oxfordshire.gov.uk/cms/content/dropped-kerbs

Comments:

The proposals seek to supply car parking for 2 vehicles in the area highlighted in the location plan. No formal plan of the car parking has been submitted but the proposals in principle are acceptable so a parking layout plan has been conditioned. It is noted that there are incidents of inconsiderate parking in the area at present, i.e. on grass verges and at bus stops. If it is necessary to remove any street furniture

then this must be requested from the relevant authority and paid for at the applicants expense. The proposals are unlikely to have any adverse impact upon the local highway network from a traffic and safety point of view, therefore I offer no objection, subject to conditions.
