This planning application takes no notice of the current village plan. It is in a field abutting a nature reserve that will suffer greatly if houses are built near it - not only the animals, but the trees and also there will be water damage due to flooding as a result of run off from the site - and the water run off into the brook will have effect on other properties in the village that will be affected by flooding - has there been any consideration about water flow and the bridges that cross the brook? Including the bridge that the A361 crosses?

There will be greater air pollution from the number of cars and their impact on traffic flow through the area - let alone the impact of a junction onto the A361 which will be extremely dangerous - there have already been accidents on this stretch of road.

Development in Banbury, Adderbury and Milcombe should be taken into consideration as these also have an effect on traffic flow through Bloxham.

The village doesn't have capacity in it's already over subscribed schools and doctors surgery. There are already plenty of houses for sale in the village on top of the current developments currently being built.
