I totally agree with the 'Keep Bloxham Rural' campaign. Bloxham has grown too quickly & enough is enough. I am totally opposed to any more building of new homes in or around the village (unless renovating old disused existing properties).

My example would be to bring to your attention of the village roads which have become totally congested, noisy, air polluted and downright dangerous with speeding drivers.

In particular the road I have to access from Bloxham Court being Barford Road. The amount of traffic (inc. HGV's) passing my house facing Barford Road has increased four fold in the past 12 yrs. This not only disrupts my sleep when on night shifts, but exiting from Bloxham Court onto Barford Road has become dangerous. Cars come speeding around the bend well in excess of 30 mph. One second the road is clear but by the time you pull out a car has appeared on your bumper, with the driver having road rage!!!

Traffic calmer's are required in between Milton Road & the mini roundabout before someone gets severely hurt in a collision.

This has been brought on by increased traffic into a village that does not have the traffic infrastructure to cope with the recent new homes expansion, let alone expanding - the village is totally congested with traffic & noise.

This is why I say no more - 'Keep Bloxham Rural'.... and definitely 'NO' to Gladman new home proposal.
