I am concerned that "the control of development" in Bloxham does not seem to be taken seriously. We have had a great deal of new house development within the last two years and are still having new houses built along the Tadmarton Road.

It seems to me that keeping Bloxham a rural area is also not taken seriously. There is nothing wrong with a community that has fields and undeveloped land within it. Bloxham has had its fair share of new homes and steps should now be taken that ensures the rural character of the village.

I am not concerned about loss of view, or property development values, but I am concerned about the quality of life which

The people of Bloxham enjoy. Its rural aspect is important, and the building of more houses diminishes that aspect.

It must be that the Council has an understanding of what it means by "control of development" - - but I have seen little evidence of development being controlled when it comes to new housebuilding in Bloxham. It is time that the Council took seriously this aspect of planning.
