Comments:

I have already objected directly to Gladman but my comments have not been included in the application. How many others have been excluded?

This is in direct conflict with our neighbourhood plan which a huge number of residents contributed to and an even bigger number support in its entirety.

This development must be declined due to the increase in residents in an already creaking village. The infrastructure is not fit to accommodate more housing with our GP surgery and primary school already in high demand.

The traffic situation, due to the awful public transport system we have, is dire and causing increased pollution especially in the High St. An 8 minute journey to Banbury takes on average 35 minutes due to the amount of traffic between 7.30 - 9am and 4.30- 7pm.

The entrance to the proposed site is onto the busy A361, right by a bend. The amount of accidents on this road is already high, this additional entrance seems likely to exacerbate the issue. There is also no pedestrian access meaning additional cars.

Finally, what about the impact on nature? As a family we have used the recreation ground and now the Slade most weekends because it is quiet and above all safe. The levels of wildlife are strong and it is one of the only public green spaces in the village.
