I strongly objected to another development in Bloxham , here are the main reasons

1) we will lose the rural feel of the village when you drive in and also removing the rural park, and the wildlife . All development are meant to respect the local character and natural assets , it will just look like another urban park area on a large housing estate .

2) unsure how the primary school which is already at capacity and no room for expansion will be able to provide school places for existing and new communities.

3) while driving home most evenings normally around 4.30pm the traffic queues on the high street from the South Newington roundabout , and my partner has the same issues in the mornings . It's already been advised that there is no feasible way of improving this .

Bloxham has already agreed to the government house building and Cherwell have already covered the plans for this . It would be a huge shame if we lost the village feel and became a village with lots of large housing estates .
