BL9 All development shall where appropriate: (c) Ensure that the impact of any additional traffic likely to be generated by the development has been satisfactorily mitigated and will not adversely affect the highway network

We have lived in Bloxham for almost 15 years and Recently the village has grown considerably in population due to a number of large housing developments. We have three children all who attend the local secondary and primary school, they currently all walk to and from school but we have increasing concerns that if a further 90 plus homes are built this will again add to the already heavily over congested A361 and side roads, particularly Traffic is at capacity at the South Newington roundabout with no feasible way to increase it according to OCC.

(NPPF para 84: it will be important to ensure that development is sensitive to its surroundings, does not have an unacceptable impact on local roads)

My daughter only aged 9 has already witnessed on her walk to school drivers shouting abuse at each other due to congestion around the school, this is completely unexceptable and in our eyes will only get worse if this planning is permitted.

Many villagers will resort to driving their children to school as it will be seen to be the safest option resulting in further traffic congestion.

We completely object to this planning application and in the interest of our children's safety we will continue to support the village in every way we can to avoid this going ahead.
