CDC has worked hard over recent years to establish sufficient development land to meet future needs in our district and this plot in Bloxham does not form any part of the approved Local Plan or the Bloxham Neighbourhood Plan. On these grounds alone this application should be rejected, however the additional load on the local infrastructure (schools, doctors, roads etc...) means that such a development is not sustainable. I hope that this rejection can send a strong message to Gladman that this obvious targeting of Bloxham is both unwelcome & futile.
