## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 - LOCAL COUNCIL OBSERVATIONS

Bicester Town Council have considered the Application No 19/01740/HYBRID and observations thereon are as follows:

RESOLVED that Bicester Town Council welcome this application, particularly the proposal for additional leisure facilities, B1 use, especially B1b as there is a demand for R&D facilities and the proposed improvements to the wetlands which should provide a biodiversity gain. Bicester Town Council would welcome a review of the design of the main A41 roundabout at Vendee Drive to deal with the added impact of this development in order to address highways and traffic concerns. The Council would also welcome enhanced public access to wetlands areas for educational and leisure purposes.
