Comments	<input type="text" value="As a resident of Caversfield for more than 12 years I feel the increased usage and development of the Bicester Airfield by Bicester Heritage is now becoming an issue and further advanced development as outlined by this application and their vision for the future needs to be restricted. Traffic around Caversfield is already becoming an issue and is regularly used as a rat run by commuters, on event days our roads become gridlocked and our streets are used by visitors for free parking. After events the cars leaving the Bicester heritage site have very little respect or consideration for residents, other roads users, or the speed restrictions in place. Bicester as whole already suffers from congested roads, adding in more daily visitors has a wider implication than just those residents that live locally in Caversfield. As is normal with these expansions very little will be done to ease the congestion.
