Two residents from the past, John Harper and Charlie Swain, approached the Colgrave family and got them to agree to donate this land to the village for a new sports field, in fact some time later it was sold to the PC for 1 by a developer. This has gone on so long both John Harper and Charlie Swain have since died. In their lifetime they both did an awful lot for Adderbury and must be turning in their graves to see it all still dragging on today. The current facilities are not good, true we have several meeting places but the largest is the village Institute and is not big enough for gathering over seventy to eighty people and with that many you can't swing a cat. I appreciate nearby residents have concerns about traffic and noise and light pollution but believe most of this can be overcome. There has no doubt been an increase in traffic along the Milton Road, it's inevitable considering all the new developments in Bloxham, Adderbury and other nearby areas, there are many newcomers to this area and most of them came with cars. In recent years there has been two parish polls called by residents who objected to this land being used for sport and leisure activity, the results on both occasions proved the majority of the community of Adderbury wanted to see the development go ahead. There is currently a group, Working For Adderbury Community, who are raising funds and seeking funding, an uphill struggle but they are determined. I hope this application is approved.</p> |
