There are plenty of shopping options in Bodicote (and won't someone consider the livelihood of the shops there?), on Bodicote Chase and at Sainsbury's which is just 1.5 miles/6 min drive away. Building a food store here will cause untold traffic issues...adding to the already incredibly heavy traffic in this area. They now feel that they have been hugely mis-led. The biggest issue is the traffic. Our road infrastructure in Banbury is struggling to cope with all the new developments already. I live on Bodicote Chase and we have seen a massive increase in traffic on Bankside since Longford Park and all its offshoots opened. To encourage more traffic to this side of town and more general movement of vehicles, is just patent madness. We were told that the chicanes were being removed from Bankside and being replaced with sleeping policemen, to help the traffic flow, but years have passed now and nothing constructive has happened to help with the extra traffic. Maybe this time, common sense could actually triumph over undisguised greed!"/>
