<b>Comments</b>	<input type="text" value="I write in strong objection to the proposed LDC for the Wroxton motocross track. I have been a resident of Hornton for the past thirteen years, my home being in the southern part of the village closest to the track. At first the noise nuisance from the track was slight and acceptable but, over the past four years, the number of race days has increased dramatically, with more races per day, and the number of motorbikes in each race has also increased such that the noise has become totally unacceptable. Far from being a venue for local riders, as was originally the case, the track has recently expanded to become a setting for national and international events. On race days the noise is now almost continuous and it has had a major detrimental effect on my life. I am an author who needs a quiet environment for my creative writing but I find now that, especially throughout the summer months, my concentration is seriously disturbed by the noise intrusion for many hours on so many weekends. The number of days that the track has been active over the past few years has increased far in excess of the 14 that should be the maximum and the organisers clearly do not conform to this limit. Cherwell District Council should have enforced the limit and, just because the council have abdicated that responsibility in the past, is no good reason for them to now increase the restriction for the future. I am further concerned that, with proposed 'practice days' to be added, the associated noise will become even more intolerable. Hence I object to the proposed LDC and request and require the enforcement of the 14 day maximum. Felix Francis"/>
