For almost all of those 34 years, the track has not been a problem. I could hear it when they were racing but this only occurred a few times a year and the noise was not too intrusive.

But in the last three or four years the situation has escalated beyond all recognition. Not only have the number of days of racing increased but the volume of noise they create has grown out of all proportion. I am now 94 years old and I would like to spend my last years enjoying a peaceful retirement in this beautiful village. But, despite being deaf in one ear, the noise generated by this track is now so loud and constant that it's unbearable to have to listen to it through my other ear.

To make weekend life bearable in this small village, please reject this application.
