Apologies for using your email address, I have only recently heard about the above application and could not find it on your portal.

I am writing to register my objection to planning application 20/02453/F made for a fuel depot between Hornton and the A422.

Our close proximity to Banbury and the M40 give ample areas for commercial development which do not impact on the countryside.

A fuel depot with large tankers coming and going will not only disrupt the wildlife and environment, create both noise and light pollution but will also add a lot more heavy goods vehicles on to the A422 making it more dangerous. I lost a school friend in 1979 who was knocked down and killed on the A422 not far from the proposed site.

Although the quarry was in no way involved, her parents later went to court to reduce the volume of traffic and to prevent the amount of mud and lying water that collected on the main road as a result of the lorries leaving the site. They won.

Please do not let another unnecessary development lead to greater risk for all of us.
