- > We live in Hornton, and are horrified to hear that a planning application has been submitted for a large oil depot almost directly next to the Hornton Grounds Farm. The farm, its land, its livelihood, and its safety will be severely affected by constant 24 hour heavy traffic, and by potential damage and pollution to the ground and the water supply.
- > The surrounding villages along the A 422 will be subject to constant noise and pollution. Hornton, lying in the valley, will be equally at risk.
