Dear Sir

I wish to make an objection on the planning application 21/00343/F on three points.

Point one:

The alterations to existing access installing 10 metre radius 'grass and kerbs' will cause interference to the access and entry of my property - Conifers, The Leys. As my driveway is exactly opposite to the proposed changes, the machinery and man power needed would impact on my access. If I am unable to get access to my driveway there is no alternative areas for parking.

Point two:

I still maintain that Tanners Lane, The Leys and the concrete road are unsuitable and are unable to cope with the amount of vehicles that would, potentially, be using it. I would also point out that the concrete road is NOT a public highway.

Point three:

I would like to address the report/pictures from PB Associates. Picture 3 shows my refuse bin outside the property's gate. Although, the bin is placed there, it is collected by foot by one of the refuse collectors and left at the top of the concrete road as depicted in picture 3 of the brown bins. I have lived at this property for 47 years and the refuse collection lorry has NEVER reversed or driven down the concrete road to collect the bins.

Please take these points into account when deciding on this planning application.
