Comments	<input type="text" value="I strongly object to this application. I feel there is an ulterior motive to this application, which, I believe, is to provide toilet facilities for a campsite rather than an agricultural barn as stated in the application. This would completely change the use of this land into something which is totally unsuitable for this conservation area. A campsite and associated toilet block (the true purpose, I believe, of this application) would, in my view, create more traffic, noise and potential pollution of the surrounding area. So far, the applicants have destroyed trees and hedgerows within the conservation area without, as far as I am aware, seeking any consultation with neighbours or any permission from the council to do so. No care has been taken to do even a half decent job of this - they have left jagged tree stumps and debris and, in my view, they have already gouged an ugly scar across this particular part of the conservation area. Now they are seeking permission to scar it even more. In my view, there has been very little thought, if any, by the applicants about the impact their actions have had and potentially will have on the conservation area or the local community. It's a privilege to live in such a beautiful area. We are mere custodians of the buildings and landscape and it's all our responsibility to maintain and protect it for future generations. People who have zero interest in protecting it and seem to put all their efforts into the exact opposite should have a look in the mirror and ask themselves what is best for the community they live in and not what is best for them as individuals. Maybe it's time for them to build metaphorical bridges within the area rather than literally tear down and destroy what makes this area so special."/>
