<b>Comments</b>	<input type="text" value="I would like to place on record my objections to this application primarily on 3 counts. 1) The high volume of speeding vans and cars that are quite obviously going to and from the venue (Vehicles with Motocross bikes on trailers) through the main run-through to the venue of Wroxton. Every weekend an event is on and I'm walking along the main road you have these convoys of vans almost always going upwards of 40/50mph through the centre of Wroxton in daylight hours which is clearly a 30mph. Wroxton has a problem with speeding vehicles at the best of times but add in the hundreds of extra vehicles who aren't from the area and quite obviously don't care about following speed limits exacerbates the problem. 2) The amount of litter (fast food packaging, Drinks cans etc) along the main road in Wroxton quite significantly and obviously increases at the same times these convoys of vans come through the village, so it wouldn't be hard to associate at least a good proportion of this increased litter to the people going to and from the venue. 3) The increase in number of event days would take it to over 1 in every 2 weekends which is a ridiculous amount of events in what is a very rural peaceful location with lots of wildlife, and with no money going into the local economy (pubs, restaurants etc) it has little to no benefit to the local communities or the council itself, with one of the restaurants you'd think would benefit already objecting strongly! Before you approve any plans I would implore you to spend some time on the main road in Wroxton when people are travelling to and at the end of an event to see these problems for yourself. As at some point either someone will get hurt from speeding or you will have to pay extra money to clear litter left behind after events. It is quite conceivable that villages the other side of the venue going toward motorways will have similar problems i.e. Pillerton, Gaydon etc"/>
