Comments:

My husband and I moved to Hornton in 2018 and only became aware of the proximity of Wroxton Motocross Track because of the noise emanating from the site on race weekends. In 2019 there was a significant increase both in the number of events and the volume of noise, which is pervasive and intrusive, and significantly reduces our ability to relax and enjoy our garden and local environment.

I believe the proposal poses significant environmental factors, not least the shocking and unauthorised track expansion and additional activity in relation to the watercourse; the consequential impact on our local wildlife and livestock; the increase in the number of vehicles using the A422 and manoeuvring through local villages; noise pollution, and a potential risk of chemical pollution from hazardous substances.

I accept the Wroxton Motocross Track as the existing 'Permitted Development Rights' allow. Development by stealth and the expectation of retrospective planning permission is completely unacceptable. As a law abiding council tax payer, I am fully backing both Hornton Parish Council and our Environmental Planning & Legal Advisor in urging you to take the necessary enforcement action to uphold the existing planning rules and laws of Cherwell District Council.
