> Please find below comments I would like adding to the portal.

>

> I am writing to object to the above application and the potential of increased usage. I have lived in the village all my life - more than 70 yrs - and 3 generations before me. I have lived on the upper reaches of Millers Lane nearly all of this time and with the prevailing winds coming mostly from the direction of the track on days when racing takes place the noise is loud and disturbing. One of my village jobs is looking after the Hornton Allotments which are located on some of the highest pieces of land in the village, behind Perkins close. Again, on race days, the noise is extremely loud.

> Another point I would like to make is that the organisers will schedule events over the few bank holidays when people who work will be enjoying time at home and in their gardens.

> My final point would be that the track now has increased dramatically from its inception and with that comes participation from larger clubs with larger crowds and larger Bikes with noisier engines.

> I hope you take on these and the many other comments seriously - there is nothing but opposition to this application from locals both in and around the area. I hope the right decision is made in order to protect the village and its community.
