Dear Mr Smith

I am writing to you to express my concern over the application for planning to develop the Wroxton MX track. I would strongly like to object to the plans, in particular the increased number of proposed events.

Myself and young family have lived in Hornton for over three years and enjoy the peaceful surrounding and safety the village offers. Whilst the motor cross has been on occasion intrusive in terms of noise, volume of people, extra traffic and littering - it was bearable at best given the suppose capped number of events. The idea of 65 events a year is very concerning. That's more than every weekend a year.

Hornton is a very small rural village. I do not see how the area would have the infrastructure to support this diary and scale of events. The negative impact would be felt for and wide by so many.

My main point of concern is one of litter. We walked with my young family in March near to the track boundary / stream running at the bottom of the track. The area is littered with rubbish directly relating to these events (plastic helmet visors, polystyrene trays, cups, crisp packets, drinks cans) all still in situ after a year of Covid lockdown, all very much damaging the environment and subsequent wildlife.

I very much hope that a compromise can be reached for a mutually agreeable and reasonable number of events for the site and that more duty of care and responsibility is taken to keep the area free from debris.
