I am writing to you ahead of the council considering the above planning application.

As a resident of Hornton since 1987 I have been used to the track being utilised by the local Banbury Motorcross Club for a few meetings a year without too much intrusion.

Over the past few years, however, we have seen the track grow in size, the amount of bikes and the noise increase and the amount of traffic travelling to and from the site escalate.

I understand that this has happened without planning and without giving people living near the track the chance to raise their concerns.

Over the past few months during lockdown many of us have enjoyed getting out more in the peace of the countryside it would be nice to preserve this and not have the roar of motorbikes over many weekends.

I am also concerned about the traffic travelling along a very small road and exiting on a blind bend. I have pulled over on three occasions to let white vans and trucks pass from the site and have got caught with a continual stream leaving with no gap in between and have been unable to get to the village. The mud dragged out on to the road makes it very slippery and I do worry about vehicles coming around the corner and not being able to stop and an accident happening.

In summary the location, in my opinion, was suitable for a small local club but is wholly unsuitable for a national venue.
