Comments	<input type="text" value="The access to this land is off a one track lane connecting Little and Great Bourton. This lane is used by big tractors, regular car traffic, horses, cyclists and walkers. Foxden Lane is not sufficiently wide enough for an increased traffic flow that building these houses would create. The road surface is already under pressure and the builders' vehicles would damage this still further. There are limited amenities in the villages other than a community hall, pub and C of E church so the occupants of the houses would be in their cars a lot to access amenities in the wider area. The internet service is poor at the best of times, more access to this will make the whole system even worse. There is no bus service to anywhere unless one walks down to the Crematorium. The local GP practice is already bulging at the seams to accommodate the current increase in patients due to building work in the vicinity. If these houses are bought by people wanting affordable housing they will need their own vehicle(s) which doesn't help their monetary situation. Thank you"/>
