We were under the impression that the large development on Garner's field was Great Bourton's allocated need for expansion and any further development contravenes the Cherwell category B village plan. This application is clearly building outside the village limits.

We believe that the large new developments on the outskirts of Banbury and Garner's field provides adequate 'affordable housing' so there is no further justification for more.

Limited public transport access further restricts the suitability for placing affordable housing in this location.

The lanes around this proposed developments are single track and regularly used by walkers, cyclists, horses and families with children. The significant increase in traffic will pose a safety risk to these people. The roads are just not suitable.

This application represents further destruction of greenbelt and we have concern about the environmental impact (trees and hedgerow have already been destroyed in 'anticipation' of the site being approved....
