<b>Comments</b>	<input type="text" value="We are disappointed that once more people are trying to expand our village with unnecessary additional houses. There has been zero consideration to the impact on wildlife, nature conservation, road access, nor highway safety, and traffic generation. We have spent the past two years suffering through developments around the Banbury area. Sandwiched between significant developments and suffering the effects of aggressive planning. The roads are not suitable for additional traffic, the quality of roads and amount of traffic build-up has been dreadful, and people's right to live in peace will be affected. The proposed position of this development will increase road traffic on a narrow lane used mainly by pedestrians. Pollution is yet another factor ignored in this willful attempt to strangle local wildlife, as is our villagers' health and well-being. We cannot see a need for additional housing in Great Bourton given the recent developments surrounding us in Garner's Field, Cherry Fields, Hanwell Fields, Longford Park, and Mollington. The requested development falls outside the village's built-up limit and does NOT meet planning criteria for a classified Category B village."/>
