With the majority of comments being objections to date there is little new that can be added, however Chacombe being a small village have many residents who are dependent upon the 500 bus service that we have already nearly lost once and do not want to do so again. Stagecoach have given us a stay of execution so long as the buses can get to and through the village in a timely manner. Banbury town council have already blighted the motorway junction with the new traffic light system/timing with huge queues on the A361 and A422 even before any new traffic is introduced. Not only that they have failed to put a set of lights on the A361 junction which will take 1000's of lorries per day when the new warehouse facility comes on line along with the HS2 traffic. If we are supposed to get greener surely public transport must be not only protected but improved and congestion will only hinder it.

I agree with every objection already submitted about the hotel, petrol filling station and fast food outlets as Banbury is already adequately serviced with these.
