Dear Sir or Madam,

The applicant has submitted an updated post excavation assessment. This assessment has addressed a number of our previous comments. It does however now omit any of the section drawings included in the earlier draft versions. These will need to be added.

We had also previously requested that further details of the burial, particularly a plan, be included. we have emailed the archaeological consultant about these matters and a further revised copy of the assessment is likely to be submitted for our agreement. It would be beneficial for the applicant to wait until this post excavation assessment has been agreed before submitting it for planning purposes.

The applicant has also submitted an email chain between County Archaeological Services and their archaeological consultant, EDP. This email chain sets out that we had requested a formal letter from the applicant confirming that the funding for the final assessment work set out in the post excavation assessment, the archiving and the publication of the results is secured. This confirmation will be required, along with an agreed post excavation assessment, before we could confirm that this condition has been met.

The archaeological fieldwork has been completed and there are no further constraints to the development commencing but this condition should not be discharged at this stage.
