Further, I question the need and benefit to the community. Certainly, there is little to no appetite for super-fast *mobile* technology in the village, which already has fibre-optic broadband. Pedestrian traffic in Kirtlington and the surrounding area is largely limited to dog-walking, jogging and so forth. The only commercial activity in the village, now that the shop is closed, can be found at the two ancient public houses, where I'm sure there's no call for this mobile technology amongst the guests. There is no upside for Kirtlington in this proposal. I implore the council not to waste any further time with this ludicrous plan, which would certainly be met with strong, persistent, on-going resistance should it be progressed any further. I am frankly appalled that we have even been presented with the prospect which has already caused a good deal of upset to those of us who put time and effort into maintaining the appearance and ambience of our village. I trust that good sense will prevail on the part of the planning department, which in the past has taken great exception to any proposed plans which might affect the enjoyment of our locality.
