

I should like to object most strongly to the planned application for a 15 metre mast & Meteo apparatus being installed just to the left of my drive.

It would be an enormous & completed out of place construction in a very prominent site, and, as I believe this is a conservation area, it could not be a less suitable position.

Traffic coming through Kirtlington on the A4095 would approach this monstrosity head on, as the road bends sharply to the right in the direction of Woodstock or sharply to the left onto the Bletchington Road.

At present the view is a pleasant, recently repaired, cotswold stone wall, with a tree across the fields behind it.

A "monopole and surrounding equipment" will hardly enhance this view.

I understand that there are also health issues from radiation. I am worried about this.

Finally, on 20th June 2013, Dr. Shyamal Bhattacharya (MBBS & MD, MSc, MRCP, FRCR) of the Department of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine, National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences, Bangalore, India, diagnosed Dr. S. Venkateswaran with diffuse large B-cell lymphoma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, stage IIIA, Ann Arbor classification, with a primary site in the right cervical lymph node, with multiple secondary sites in the left cervical lymph nodes, mediastinal lymph nodes, liver, and bone marrow. He was also found to have mild peripheral neuropathy. He was treated with R-CHOP chemotherapy (Rituximab + Cyclophosphamide + Doxorubicin + Vincristine + Prednisone) for six cycles. He has been in complete remission since then.
