To have a substantial number of new houses would increase the traffic volume through the village which is already at breaking point. Among dog walkers we all comment on that the traffic is an accident waiting to happen. At the weekends when there is a Karting event the volume of cars is drastically worse and when it is raining you can be guaranteed to be splashed as the drainage system is unable to cope. I drive in and out of the village very day via Alkerton hill and I am very distressed by the pressure the extra number of houses will put of the road, it is very tight by the Old school House on the corner on Alkerton Hill, I often meet a bus and I just wonder how long it will be before there is a serious accident, I pray it will not be me.
