Comments	I object to the planning proposal on the following grounds: I understand that the proposal is contrary to the Cherwell local plan. Shenington is a Category C Village under the Policy Villages 1 of the CLP 2031 and we understand that only infill and conversion is permitted. This proposal goes way beyond infill. The number of properties proposed is ridiculous, proportionate to the current size of the village. The proposal for 49 properties would represent an enormous growth overnight, over the current housing stock of around 180 homes. This proportion would be significant for a town the size of Banbury, but in a small village like Shenington, it would completely change the character and appearance of the village. We believe it would spoil the local countryside and considerably negatively affect the quality of life of villagers, particularly those living close to the proposed site. It's a preposterous proposal which is insensitive, unfair and potentially very damaging to the village. There are insufficient local amenities to support that number of additional people - sewerage, highways, public transport and electricity. We frequently experience power cuts, and trucks and buses are forever getting into trouble, particularly in icy conditions. 49 homes would translate into roughly 100 additional cars and a massive increase in daily traffic going through both Shenington and Alkerton, mostly to the A422 Strafford-Banbury road. The current issues, as frequently reported by the parish council, surrounding speeding would be exacerbated. The safety of pedestrians, already accentuated by the lack of a footpath between Shenington and Alkerton, on a narrow road with very sharp bends, would be further threatened. We oppose any kind of speed bump or chicane-style road furniture on Alkerton Hill and are concerned that extra volume of traffic on the road through our village from such a development would result in increased pressure for these kinds of measures to be introduced.
