Comments	<input type="text" value="I object to the development. I live in the village with my mum and 2 younger siblings. The roads to and through the are narrow and twisty and pavement is very limited and crucially there is no space for any through Alkerton and I doubt on Rattlecomb either. The main road through the village is already busy enough and I feel worried for my siblings and their friends about crossing it. If the development went ahead I believe it would segregate the village between those who live on one side of Rattlecomb and those who live on the other, as well as cut off children from visiting friends who live in the Shenington part and those who live in the Alkerton part. The village is category C so only infill or redevelopment should be allowed. This is neither. The road through Alkerton is already very dangerous. The doctors surgery is used by surrounding villages and many people who drive through the village but don't live in it race through it. This is especially bad through Alkerton and the out the other side of Shenington near the level and beyond towards Christmas corner. There are so many near misses and the ttafgic backs up on Stocking Lane at school drop offs and pick ups. Please don't let the development happen. The village roads can not cope with more traffic and the village itself is category C. Thank you."/>
